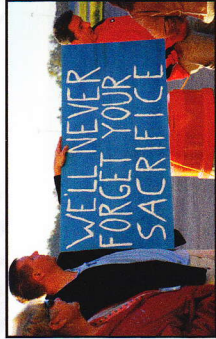




The Facts:

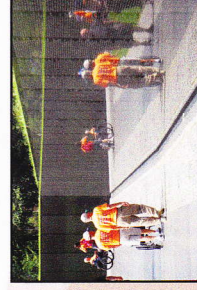
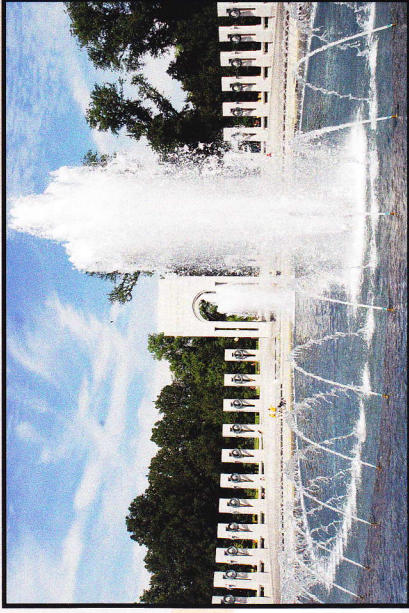

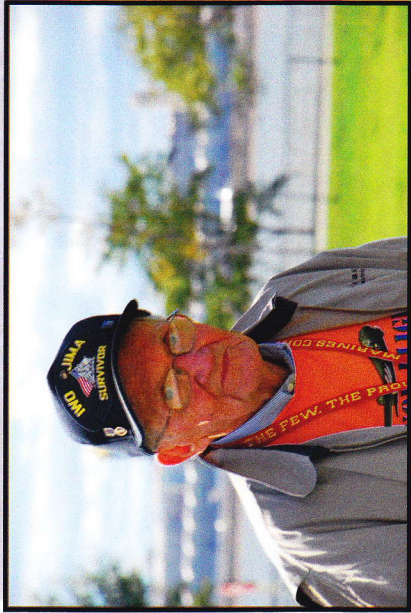

Honor Flight Northwest Ohio's mission is to fly America's veterans to Washington, D.C. to visit the memorials that have been dedicated to them. This *all expense paid trip*, is a token of our Nation's appreciation for their service, and for their sacrifice.



Our program operates solely from the contributions of time, money and effort of its volunteers, guardians and donors. Our guardians pay their own expenses for the privilege of escorting our heroes for the day.

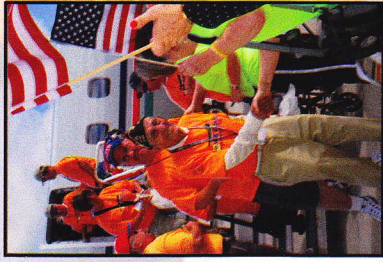

The History of Honor Flight:

The inaugural Honor Flight took place in May of 2005. Six small planes flew out of Springfield, Ohio taking twelve World War II veterans on a visit to the memorial



in Washington, D.C. As word of the program spread, other states began organizing their own hubs. Currently, there are 39 states that have one or more Honor Flight hubs helping to accomplish this mission.



Since its inception in 2007, Honor Flight Northwest Ohio, has proudly flown **859 heroes** to Washington, D.C. with the distinction of having a *perfect safety record!*



To date, over 81,000 veterans have flown, free of charge, to visit the memorials dedicated to their service.

Let's continue the mission!

What to expect:

- ★ All veterans flying on a Honor Flight with Honor Flight Northwest Ohio will be provided with the following amenities:
- ★ Transportation to and from Toledo Express Airport, the day of the flight.*
- ★ Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner, as well as snacks and water throughout the day.
- ★ T-shirt and hat commemorating their flight
- ★ Deluxe tour bus transportation
- ★ Medical equipment including wheelchairs and oxygen. In addition, a trained medical team accompanies every flight.
- ★ A personal guardian to assist the veterans throughout the day
- ★ All veterans are selected based upon the date their applications are received in our office.**
- ★ Our current priority is WW II Veterans and those veterans that are terminally ill.



* Transportation considerations will be coordinated prior to the flight and based upon the veteran's location, and if they are being transported by a family member. For safety: Veterans are not permitted to drive themselves to or from the airport on flight day.

** In special cases, Honor Flight NWO reserves the right to prioritize specific veterans based upon their medical status.
